## D Day

- June 6, 1944
- Russian have defeat the <u>Germans</u> and are moving East
  - Germans lose Stalingrad
- Americans are victorious and fighting for <u>Italy</u>
- Successfully free Italy and beat the Germans

#### The Move on to France

- Having the Germans occupied in Italy allowed the allies to move forward with their plan to open up the long awaited western front in Europe
- The next goal is to free <u>France</u>





#### The Plan




- Winston Churchill and Franklin Roosevelt agreed it was time to open up a new front in the West through the beaches of France
- The <u>obvious</u> choice for a landing area was the <u>Pas</u> de <u>Calais</u> so the Allies decided to attack in <u>Normandy</u> instead but believed they had to <u>deceive</u> the Germans they intended to attack elsewhere

## Operation "Overlord"





- There would be five sectors that would be attacked:
- 1. Utah American
- 2. Omaha American
- 3. Gold British
- 4. Juno Canadian
- 5. Sword British

#### The Time Has Come

- On the evening of June 5<sup>th</sup> paratroopers dropped in to secure bridges for the allied advance
- Heavy bombers dropped their payloads on what was supposed to be the beach defences
- In the early morning the largest armada of ships left Britain for the French coast



### 10 long weeks

- They fight on the beaches of France for <u>10</u> long weeks
- A <u>stalemate</u> ensues
- The <u>Allies</u> are victorious and it sets off a long line of victorious and surrenders in the <u>Allies</u> favor!

#### End of WWII: Europe

- The Soviets were the first to discover the <u>Death Camps</u> in Germany and make reports that will shock the world.
- It is generally accepted that on April 30, 1945, Adolf Hitler committed suicide with his new wife Eva Braun in a bunker during the Battle for Berlin.



#### End of WWII: V-E Day

• V-E Day (Victory in Europe day) was May 7 and 8 1945. These are the two days that the unconditional surrender of the Axis Powers in Europe were accepted and signed.

 The War in Europe was officially over.



# Meeting of England, US, and Russia

- Yalta Conference (February 1945)
  - Surrender of Germany, Italy, and Japan
  - Create United Nations
  - Japan does not surrender
  - Divide Austria and German into <u>4 occupied</u> <u>zones</u> controlled by US, England, France, England, and Russia





# Because Japan Won't Surrender.....

- In order to bring the war to an end quickly, President Harry S. Truman, decided that a show of <u>extreme force</u> would end the fighting.
- Work at site in <u>Los Alamos, New Mexico</u> to create atomic bomb
- The first successful detonation of an atomic bomb occurred on July 6, 1945
  - Called the <u>Trinity test</u>


# Because Japan Won't Surrender.....

- On August 6, 1945, "<u>Little Boy</u>" was dropped on <u>Hiroshima</u>.
- The U.S.A. then gave Japan an ultimatum, unconditional surrender by the Japanese or there would be a second nuclear attack.
- The city was chosen because it was an important industrial center
- The city's population at the time was about <u>255,000 people</u>
- Destroyed <u>63</u>% of the city
- It is estimated that <u>80,000</u> people died instantly
- Thousands died weeks and months later from <u>radiation</u> sickness and burns

# Because Japan Won't Surrender.....

- On August 9, 1945, with Japan failing to surrender, a second nuclear bomb called "<u>Fat Man</u>" was dropped on <u>Nagasaki</u>.
- Industrial center and a <u>major port</u> on the coast
- It is estimated that <u>200,000</u> people were in the city
- More than 40,000 were killed instantly

- On August 15, 1945, <u>Japan surrendered</u> to the Allies.
  - Known as V-J day
